

Instructions for Authors

Further information about the journal can be found on the [Pavement Preservation Journal](#) homepage. Technical paper submissions are solicited for select focus areas. Note these guidelines do not apply for articles of special interest to be published in the magazine.

1. Introduction

Manuscripts must be prepared following the guidelines. Failure to do so may result in delayed publication and may compromise the effectiveness of search engine capabilities. Therefore, authors are strongly encouraged to read these notes carefully before preparing a manuscript for submission.



All published research articles in this journal undergo peer review, based on initial editor screening and independent expert referees. They must be original, not under consideration for publication or in press elsewhere or previously published. Authors who fail to adhere to this condition will be charged with all and any costs incurred by the *Pavement Preservation Journal*, and those papers will not be published.

2. Article Submission

All manuscripts should be submitted by e-mail to the editor-in-chief. They should be attachments, made using a standard word processing program, such as MS WORD or Adobe pdf. They should be submitted to:

3. Manuscripts

- Non-discriminatory language is mandatory.
- Each manuscript should have five to six key words.
- Manuscripts are accepted only in English.
- Manuscripts should be double-spaced throughout, including the reference section.
- Abstracts of 100 - 150 words are required for all papers submitted and should precede the text of a paper.
- Manuscripts should be compiled in the following order:
 - title page
 - abstract
 - keywords
 - main text
 - acknowledgments
 - appendices (as appropriate)
 - references
 - table(s) with caption(s) on individual sheets
 - figure caption(s) (as a list).
- Section headings should be concise and numbered sequentially, using a decimal system for subsections.
- All units must be SI, and not italicized.
- When using a word which is or is asserted to be a proprietary term or trade mark, authors must use the symbol [®] or [™]; alternatively a footnote can be inserted using the wording below:

This article includes a word that is or is asserted to be a proprietary term or trade mark. Its inclusion does not imply it has acquired for legal purposes a non-proprietary or general significance, nor is any other judgment implied concerning its legal status.

4. Copyright

It is a condition of publication that authors vest or license copyright of their articles, including abstracts, in The Foundation for Pavement Preservation. This enables us to ensure full copyright protection and to disseminate the article, and the *Journal*, to the widest possible readership in print and electronic formats as appropriate. Authors may, of course, use the material elsewhere after publication providing that prior permission is obtained from the Foundation. A copyright form will be sent out by e-mail on receipt of a final submission. Authors are themselves responsible for obtaining permission to reproduce copyright material from other sources.

Exceptions are made for authors who are employees of the US Government, whose policies prohibit copyright transfers to other parties. We ask that a signed statement to this effect be submitted when returning proofs for accepted papers.
